Repeat Prescriptions

Please ensure that you organise your requests for repeat prescriptions in good time to allow our staff to deal with them efficiently. Please be aware that with effect from 8th March 2017 all repeat prescription requests will take 3 working days (72 hours) to process. This is due to the current increase in patient demand and the pressure of NHS work that we face.

You may request these either;

- In person, by leaving the white, right hand side of your last repeat prescription or a hand-written repeat prescription request here at Woolston Lodge Surgery.
- You may post your repeat prescription request to the surgery (if you wish to include a stamped, self addressed envelope, your prescription will be posted back to you).
- Order online. You need to be registered for this service, please complete a slip at reception to obtain a username and password.
- If you also nominate your regular pharmacy, we will digitally send your prescription directly to them on your behalf. (see page four for more details)

Requests for repeat prescriptions cannot be taken over the telephone.

Wasted Medicine

Unused prescription medicines cost Hampshire and Southampton CCG over ten million pounds every year.

Do you know? Sometimes patients or carers with repeat prescriptions continue to get more medicines than they really need and stockpile them at home. Unused medicines cannot be recycled or used by anyone else. Unused medicines kept at home are also a safety risk for children and others who might take them.

How can you help? Only order what you need, check what medicines you still have before re-ordering. If you don't need the medicine don't order it! If you need the medicine in the future you can request it then. If you need to go into hospital please remember to take all your medication with you. Please remember that your medicines are prescribed for you; it's not safe to share them.

Even if you never open them, once medicines have left the pharmacy they cannot be recycled. Please take any unused medication to the pharmacy for safe disposal.

Online Services

You can book, cancel and amend appointments, change your contact details and request repeat

prescriptions 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

nursing or appointments with a health care assistant.

You may recall that Spitfire surgery was set to close at the end of March, however, we have been granted a small extension on the lease which will certainly help whilst the building works are completed. We are hoping that we will be able to use Spitfire Surgery until such time that we have at least two of the new clinical rooms in full working order, so that we are more easily able to accommodate the additional staff here at Woolston Lodge.

Patient Participation Group

Access Self Care - Better Care

Pharmacy First for Minor Ailments

Are you eligible for free prescriptions?

If you have certain minor ailments or conditions you may be eligible for Pharmacy First - The new minor ailments service. The service enables those who get free prescriptions to go straight to their pharmacist for a consultation, instead of going to their GP for a prescription.

You must be registered with a Southampton City GP practice and eligible for free prescriptions to use this service which covers the following ailments:

- Cough
- Upper respiratory tract infection
- Diarrhoea
- Haemorrhoids
- Hay fever
- Headache
- Minor burns and scalds
- Contact dermatitis
- Musculoskeletal pain & soft tissue injury

- Cold
- Ear Ache
- Constipation
- Insect Bites & Stings
- Dry Eye
- Head lice
- Vaginal Thrush
- Athletes' Foot
- Thread Worm
- Fever in Children

- Sore Throat
- Earwax
- Mouth Ulcers

Travel Advice

We offer a travel advice service for both patients and non patients who will be travelling abroad and require travel advice &/or vaccinations. To make use of this service, each person travelling should complete a travel risk assessment form and return this to the practice. If you wish to use this service, please contact us with as much time as possible prior to your trip to ensure that we can accommodate you.

We have recently altered the way we send you the confirmation text message when you book an appointment. You will no longer receive this as soon as the appointment is booked, but instead, your confirmation message will come a week before your appointment and then a further reminder text message will be sent to you the day before your appointment. This new service will also allow you to cancel your appointment by texting the word CANCEL back to us to the number given. Hopefully this will make it easier for patients to cancel any appointments which are no longer needed which can then be used for other patients.
